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GOVT WILL DECIDE TIMING OF MONSOON SESSION AFTER CONSULTATIONS: PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS MINISTER

Sessions Have Begun in Sept Too: Pralhad Joshi

SENSE OF URGENCY Opposition parties want an early monsoon session of Parliament to discuss the Chinese incursions, economic meltdown, Covid-19 and lockdown

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New Delhi: The government is unlikely to accept the Opposition's demand for an early monsoon session of Parliament or go out of its way to facilitate standing committee meetings.



March, there is also time till September before the six month period ends. So, there is no delay at all." The minister's comments indicate the government may be looking at an August-September timeline for the monsoon session, subject to review of the Covid-19 situation.

of standing committee meetings, Joshi said, "when some Opposition members and chairpersons tried to convene some standing committees meetings, many MPs expressed unwillingness to participate in them by travelling to Delhi because of Covid-19, which is quite serious in Delhi though it is showing improvement now. What can government do if a large number of MPs don't want to come to Delhi right now to attend standing committee meetings? After all, there are health concerns... When I tried to travel by plane to Bangalore yesterday, the first flight had

to be cancelled because only a handful of passengers were there. That is how it is now." After presiding officers of both Houses rejected the demand of some Opposition chairpersons for virtual meetings of House panels, by citing 'confidentiality clause', some MPs have been routinely seeking special facilities/exemption for the meetings. One House panel met a few days back, the first time since the lockdown, while chairpersons of some panels have scheduled more meetings subject to availability of quorum.

“Unlocking is happening now. Parliament session will certainly take place in due course. The government will decide the timing of the session after consultations, as per rules and conventions. But let me also point out that there have been many instances in the past when the monsoon session of Parliament started in late August or early September. So, there have been delays,” Joshi said when ET asked him about the demands from Opposition parties for an early monsoon session of Parliament to discuss the Chinese incursions, economic meltdown, Covid-19 and lockdown.

Joshi said that since the last session ended only by March end, there was time till end September to adhere to the law on holding a session at least once in six months. “Since the last session ended in

14 MINISTERS IN CABINET ARE NOT MLAS AT PRESENT

Scindia Has His Way; With 28 New Names, MP Cabinet has 33 Mins

12 of the 33 ministers are from the Gwalior-Chambal region, which has 16 seats going to bypolls

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New Delhi: The BJP central leadership seems to have struck a diplomatic balance by accommodating the candidates of the 'Maharaj' (Jyotiraditya Scindia) and 'Shivraj' (Singh Chouhan), and some new faces among the 28 new ministers who took oath in Madhya Pradesh on Thursday.



Singh Parmar became ministers for the first time. The selection of ministers has been done carefully, keeping in mind the upcoming by-polls to 24 seats.

Regional Representation Region-wise, 12 of the 33 ministers are from the Gwalior-Chambal region. Of the 24 seats for which bypolls will be held, 16 seats fall in this belt. Malwa has got eight ministers while Bundelkhand has got four. Mahakaushal, a region where BJP did well in the 2018 elections, saw minimal representation with only one minister. Other ministers are from the Vindhya and Neemad regions.

However, 'Team Scindia' has emerged the winner with nine of his loyalists taking oath on Thursday. In the 33-member cabinet, Scindia's men have 11 berths, almost 33% of the entire cabinet. MP can have a maximum of 34 ministers. Twenty ministers swore in as cabinet ministers on Thursday while eight ministers took oath as ministers of state.

Three Congress MLAs who had defected to the BJP, Adal Singh Kansana, Hardeep Dang and Bisahul Singh, have become ministers. In all, 14 former Congress MLAs have become ministers. For the first time, there are 14 ministers in the state cabinet who are not MLAs at present.

Sixteen BJP leaders took oath, seven of whom were ministers in the earlier Shivraj Singh Chouhan cabinet. Senior leaders Gopal Bhargava, Bhupendra Singh, Vijay Shah, Yashodhara Raju, Vishwas Sarang and Jagdish Dewda were among those who could make it to the cabinet. Gaurishankar Bisen, Sanjay Pathak, Ajay Bishnoi and a few other ex-ministers also could not find a place in the cabinet.

Tablighis From Foreign Nations Can't Ask to be Deported as Matter of Right: Govt to SC

New Delhi: The Central government told the Supreme Court on Thursday that foreign nationals who indulged in Tablighi activities while in India on a tourist visa will have to face the consequences of their actions and cannot seek to be deported back to their countries as a matter of right.

Uma Bharati Appears In Person Before Special CBI Court to Record Statement

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New Delhi: Uma Bharati, an accused in the Babri Masjid demolition trial, appeared in person before a special CBI court in Lucknow on Thursday to record her statement in connection with the case.

Following Bharati, the Court is set to record the statements of senior BJP leaders LK Advani, Murli Manohar Joshi, and Kalyan Singh via video conferencing.

The special CBI Court at Kaiserbagh resumed hearings in the trial on Thursday. It was sealed on June 29 after a local lawyer was found positive for the Covid-19 virus.

ET reported on June 26 that after repeated reminders and a delay of over one month, the video conferencing apparatus sought by the special CBI Court, which is conducting day-to-day trial in the case, had been finally installed.

JOINT BATTLE AGAINST COVID-19

In NCR Review, Shah Meets CMs of UP, Haryana, Delhi

New Delhi: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday held a meeting with the chief ministers of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Delhi to discuss the COVID-19 situation in the national capital and its adjoining areas, located in the two neighbouring states. Delhi and the National Capital Region (NCR) have seen a spike in the number of coronavirus cases, leading to the Home Minister stepping in to handle the situation and improve the health infrastructure.

In Ghaziabad, so far 851 people have been infected by the coronavirus and 56 have died. A total of 14,941 COVID-19 cases were detected in Haryana and the virus so far has claimed 240 lives in the state.

Shah reviewed the COVID-19 situation in Delhi-NCR with the three chief ministers, a home ministry official said. Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan was also present in the meeting.

Gurgaon and Faridabad have reported 92 and 80 fatalities, respectively. The two districts put together account for over 9,300 infections. Restrictions imposed earlier on the free movement of people between Delhi and NCR became a major issue during the coronavirus lockdown.

The NCR comprises districts belonging to Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan. The prominent ones being Gautam Buddha Nagar (Noida) and Ghaziabad (both Uttar Pradesh) and Gurgaon, Faridabad (both in Haryana).

The Uttar Pradesh chief minister on Thursday had asked officials to stay alert on the movement of people in NCR districts to check the spread of COVID-19.

Chief Ministers of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Delhi - Yogi Adityanath, Manohar Lal Khattar and Arvind Kejriwal respectively - attended the meeting through video-conference. The novel coronavirus has infected 89,000 people in Delhi and killed 2,803 as on Wednesday.

“By remaining alert in NCR districts (of UP), the spread of COVID-19 can be checked. There should be alertness on movement in these districts,” a statement quoted the CM as telling senior officials during a meeting with them.

In Uttar Pradesh, the coronavirus tally has reached 24,056 cases and 718 deaths.

On June 18, at a meeting, the home minister had said a common strategy should be framed for Delhi and NCR to tackle the coronavirus pandemic and added that the suburbs like Gurgaon, Noida and Ghaziabad can't be separated from the national capital in this battle.

In the NCR district of Gautam Buddha Nagar, 2,362 COVID-19 cases have been detected positive and 22 people have lost their lives so far.

The home minister swung into action to handle the coronavirus situation in the national capital since early last month after criticism in different quarters of the Delhi government's handling of the COVID-19 situation, with complaints of non-availability of beds in hospitals for patients and difficulty in getting the tests done in laboratories.

Cong, NCP Upset With Uddhav for Reimposing Lockdown

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Mumbai: The Congress and the Nationalist Congress party Ministers are both miffed with the latest lockdown measures initiated in Mumbai and the neighbouring districts. The Congress and the NCP leaders have claimed that they were not taken in to confidence when these lockdown measures were initiated.

NCP Chief Sharad Pawar on Thursday held a meeting with Home Minister Anil Deshmukh and the unilateral manner in which the restrictions have been imposed in several parts of the state had apparently come up in the meeting between the two. NCP Chief Sharad Pawar is likely to hold a meeting with Chief Minister Uddhav Thackeray soon to discuss the issues. The NCP Chief has also been approached by several businessmen and traders within the state who have complained that the prolonged lock down was leading to an economic crisis that will not just affect them but will also cripple the state.

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
