GOVT WILL DECIDE TIMING OF MONSOON SESSION AFTER CONSULTATIONS: PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS MINISTER

Sessions Have Begun in Sept Too: Pralhad Joshi

SENSE OF URGENCY Opposition parties want an early monsoon session of Parliament to discuss the Chinese incursions, economic meltdown, Covid-19 and lockdown

New Delhi: The government is unlikely to accept the Opposition's demand for an early monsoon session of Parliament or go out of its way to facilitate standing committee meetings. Parliamentary Affairs Minister Pralhad Joshi told ET that the government will convene the monsoon session in due course, but added that there have been instances when monsoon sessions began in late August or early September.

"Unlocking is happening now. Parliament session will certainly take place in due course. The government will decide the timing of the session after consultations, as per rules and conventions. But let me also point out that there have been many instances in the past when the monsoon session of Parliament started in late August or early September. So, there have been delays," Joshi said when ET asked him about the demands from Opposition parties for an early monsoon session of Parliament to discuss the Chinese incursions, economic meltdown, Covid-19 and lockdown.

Joshi said that since the last session ended only by March end, there was time till end September to adhere to the law on holding a session at least once in six months. "Since the last session ended in



March, there is also time till September before the six month period ends. So, there is no delay at all." The minister's comments indicate the government may be looking at an August-September timeline for the monsoon session, subject to review of the Covid-19 situation.

"Around 4,000 to 5,000 people, including around 2,000 staff, have to be in the vicinity of Parliament House during a session. Because of Covid-19, there have been health concerns," he said. On Opposition leaders' seeking special arrangements for early resumption

of standing committee meetings, Joshi said, "when some Opposition members and chairpersons tried to convene some standing committees meetings, many MPs expressed unwillingness to participate in them by travelling to Delhi because of Covid-19, which is quite serious in Delhi though it is showing improvement now. What can government do if a large number of MPs don't want to come to Delhi right now to attend standing committee meetings? After all, there are health concerns... When I tried to travel by plane to Bangalore yesterday, the first flight had

to be cancelled because only a handful of passengers were there. That is how it is now."


After presiding officers of both Houses rejected the demand of some Opposition chairpersons for virtual meetings of House panels, by citing 'confidentiality clause', some MPs have been routinely seeking special facilities/exemption for the meetings. One House panel met a few days back, the first time since the lockdown, while chairpersons of some panels have scheduled more meetings subject to availability of quorum.

14 MINISTERS IN CABINET ARE NOT MLAs AT PRESENT

Scindia Has His Way; With 28 New Names, MP Cabinet has 33 Mins

12 of the 33 ministers are from the Gwalior-Chambal region, which has 16 seats going to bypolls

New Delhi: The BJP central leadership seems to have struck a diplomatic balance by accommodating the candidates of the 'Maharaja' (Jyotiraditya Scindia) and 'Shivraj' (Singh Chouhan), and some new faces among the 28 new ministers who took oath in Madhya Pradesh on Thursday. With this, the 100-day old Shivraj Singh Chouhan has got a full cabinet, with 33 ministers.

However, 'Team Scindia' has emerged the winner with nine of his loyalists taking oath on Thursday. In the 33-member cabinet, Scindia's men have 11 berths, almost 33% of the entire cabinet. MP can have a maximum of 34 ministers.

Twenty ministers swore in as cabinet ministers on Thursday while eight ministers took oath as ministers of state.

Sixteen BJP leaders took oath, seven of whom were ministers in the earlier Shivraj Singh Chouhan cabinet. Senior leaders Gopal Bhargava, Bhopendra Singh, Vijay Shah, Yashodhara Raje, Vishwas Sarang and Jagdish Dewda were among those who could make it to the cabinet. Gaurishankar Bisen, Sanjay Pathak, Ajay Bishnoi and a few other ex-ministers also could not find a place in the cabinet.

Three Congress MLAs who had defected to the BJP Adal Singh Kansana, Hardeep Dang and Bisahul Singh, have become ministers. In all, 14 former Congress MLAs have become ministers. For the first time, there are 14 ministers in the state cabinet who are not MLAs at present.

Nine new faces from the BJP took oath as ministers as part of the party's central leadership's thinking that new leaders be given a chance. Usha Thakur, Prem Singh Patel, Om Prakash Sakhlecha, Mohan Yadav, Bharat Singh Kushwaha, Ramkhelwan Patel, Ram Kishor Kawre and Indra

Singh Parmar became ministers for the first time.

The selection of ministers has been done carefully keeping in mind the upcoming by-polls to 24 seats.

Regional Representation
Region-wise, 12 of the 33 ministers are from the Gwalior-Chambal region. Of the 24 seats for which bypolls will be held, 16 seats fall in this belt.

Malwa has got eight ministers while Bundelkhand has got four Mahakaushal, a region where BJP did well in the 2018 elections, saw minimal representation with only one minister. Other ministers are from the Vindhya and Neemad regions.

For the past three months, Scindia was under tremendous pressure because of the delay in cabinet expansion. The Congress party had been constantly attacking him for not securing his loyalists important places. As he got his men into the cabinet, Scindia was a relieved man today.

"This is not a cabinet expansion but the expansion of Jan Sevaks in MP. In the past few months, people were trying to malign our character. To them, my answer is Tiger Abhi Zinda Hai." Jyotiraditya Scindia told media persons — a line often quoted by Shivraj Chouhan in the past, the last time being in December 2019.

Tablighis From Foreign Nations Can't Ask to be Deported as Matter of Right: Govt to SC

New Delhi: The Central government told the Supreme Court on Thursday that foreign nationals who indulged in Tablighi activities while in India on a tourist visa will have to face the consequences of their actions and cannot seek to be deported back to their countries as a matter of right. They would also be blacklisted to prevent them from re-entering the country in the future, the government said. The government said that the visas of 2679 foreigners, including 9 OIC card holders, have been cancelled in this connection so far, it said.

Only some of them, who were available on email, have been told of the cancellation of their visas. The orders against

the others would be executed at their port of exit. Some 227 foreign Tablighi Jamaat members had left India before a look-out circular could be issued against them, the court was told. No foreign Tablighi Jamaat member had been deported so far as criminal proceedings were going on against them under various provisions of the law.

These include the disaster management act, the diseases act and the foreigners' act. They cannot seek to be deported to the country of their origin as a

matter of right and would be deported only after the legal processes against them are complete,

government said. The right to grant, rescind or cancel visas, the government said, was a sovereign function of the executive and cannot be subjected to judicial scrutiny under the right to life and liberty guaranteed to Indian citizens under the Constitution, the government said. These foreign nationals were trapped inside the Tablighi Markaz headquarters in Delhi when a nationwide lockdown was imposed in the city and were accused of spreading corona in the city, a charge they deny.

Uma Bharati Appears In Person Before Special CBI Court to Record Statement

New Delhi: Uma Bharti, an accused in the Babri Masjid demolition trial, appeared in person before a special CBI court in Lucknow on Thursday to record her statement in connection with the case.

Bharti, the national vice president of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party, is accused of inciting the mob that demolished the 16th century mosque. She recorded her statement under Section 313 of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC).

The special CBI Court at Kaiserbagh resumed hearings in the trial on Thurs-

day. It was sealed on June 29 after a local lawyer was found positive for the Covid-19 virus.

Following Bharti, the court is set to record the statements of senior BJP leaders L K Advani, Murlough Manohar Joshi, and Kalyan Singh via video conferencing.

On June 29, Sadhvi Ritambhar, another accused in the case, was questioned over her alleged involvement in the demolition.

ET reported on June 26 that after repeated reminders and a delay of over one month, the video conferencing apparatus sought by the special CBI Court, which is conducting day-to-day trial in the case, had been finally installed.
